Our roadmap to compliance

The Requirement

The Energy Savings Opportunity Scheme (ESOS) regulations require large businesses to appoint an ESOS Lead Assessor to carry out an organisation-wide energy audit, and produce a list of recommendations for reducing energy consumption. The recommendations must be reviewed at Director level before participants can submit a compliance notification to the scheme regulator. ESOS will apply to your organisation if:



It has more than 250 employees; OR



It has an annual turnover exceeding €50m and a balance sheet exceeding €43m; OR



It is a part of a group that includes at least one entity in the UK that meets either of the criteria above.

Benefits?

Following our roadmap will mean eliminating the risk of a legal breach, namely fines of up to £50,000 and the reputational risk of being 'named and shamed'. Our ESOS compliance programme will also help you identify further energy efficiency measures, and confirm whether previous measures implemented are having the desired effect.

By profiling the energy consumption of the organisation as a whole, you will be able to identify and prioritise areas for future energy efficiency investment and streamline the reporting process taking advantage of the overlap with other schemes such as the new **Streamlined Energy & Carbon Reporting (SECR)**.

Furthermore, by implementing some of the ESOS recommendations, you can demonstrate environmental credentials whilst at the same time reducing overheads and recouping the cost of the mandatory assessment.

- » Compliance period: 6th Dec 2015 to 5th Dec 2019
- » Qualification date: 31st Dec 2018
- » Submission deadline: 5th Dec 2019
